Through our outreach programming, we are providing services to the Dartmouth East Community, this parenting journey home visitor will be based out of Dartmouth East and serve the members of the Dartmouth East Community.

The Parenting Journey is a home visitation program that provides support for families experiencing complex social, emotional and familial challenges. Parenting Journey Home Visitors work collaboratively with families to build meaningful helping relationships while collectively identifying strengths, resources, challenges and priorities, using a holistic and harm reduction framework.

The Parenting Journey Home Visitor will provide support to families and their children age 3 to 16 years in the following areas:

- child/youth growth and development
- parent-child relationships
- parenting knowledge and skills
- family life management
- community connections and referrals

### Responsibilities

- Specific duties include:
- Working with families to determine families' strengths, resources, and areas for development, priorities and needs.
- Developing goals with families using a formal goal-setting process.
- Developing and implementing individualized family plans in a collaborative manner with families that outline goals, strategies, roles and responsibilities and timelines.
- Making referrals for families to other formal/informal supports and services.
- Participating in regular, weekly supervision and informal debriefs.
- Participating in case conferencing that includes families and other service providers.
- Participating in ongoing training and mandatory professional development.

#### Qualifications

Applicants, for Parenting Journey Home Visitor positions, will demonstrate proof of the ability of these competencies:

- Work cooperatively and collaboratively with all staff;
- Develop positive personal and professional relationships;
- Strong communication skills in preparing correspondence with follow-up processes;
